What is Technical Assistance?

Definition: a process of providing help to resolve a problem and/or create innovative approaches related to juvenile justice and/or delinquency prevention.

Four Levels of TA


1. **Low Level TA** involves brief consultation and help with finding information, sharing information, gathering materials, or using a resource person.
2. **Moderate level TA** involves the same assistance as low level TA, but when more issues or challenges are found, additional consultation or resource persons are used.
3. **On-site TA** requires FVTC staff and/or a consultant to visit the site.
4. **Long-term TA** involves an on-site visit and extended assistance.

Tribal Youth Program Information - American Indians and Alaska Natives rely on their youth to carry their tribes and traditions into the future. Unfortunately, violent crime, substance abuse and mental health issues prevent some tribal communities from upholding that responsibility. But with the help of the **Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) Tribal Youth Program (TYP)** and Fox Valley Technical College (FVTC), Criminal Justice Center for Innovation (CJCI), many of these children and tribes are seeing brighter futures.


TYP provides grants, training, technical assistance, and guidance documents for the development of culturally-based programs designed to prevent and control juvenile delinquency, reduce violent crime and improve tribal juvenile justice systems, thereby increasing the overall safety of tribal communities.

Accessing Training and Technical Assistance - As the technical assistance (TA) provider, FVTC CJCI will assist tribes and tribal organizations in resolving challenges, in using creative new approaches, and in using strength-based practices to improve tribal juvenile justice systems and prevent delinquency.

There are four different levels of TA available - low level, moderate level, on-site, and long-term. Areas of TA may include community needs and strengths assessment, forming collaborative partnerships in the community, court and justice system development, strategic planning and program development and sustainability, team building, traditional healing approaches, code development, substance abuse and mental health treatment, community development, research and evaluation, and/or database development.

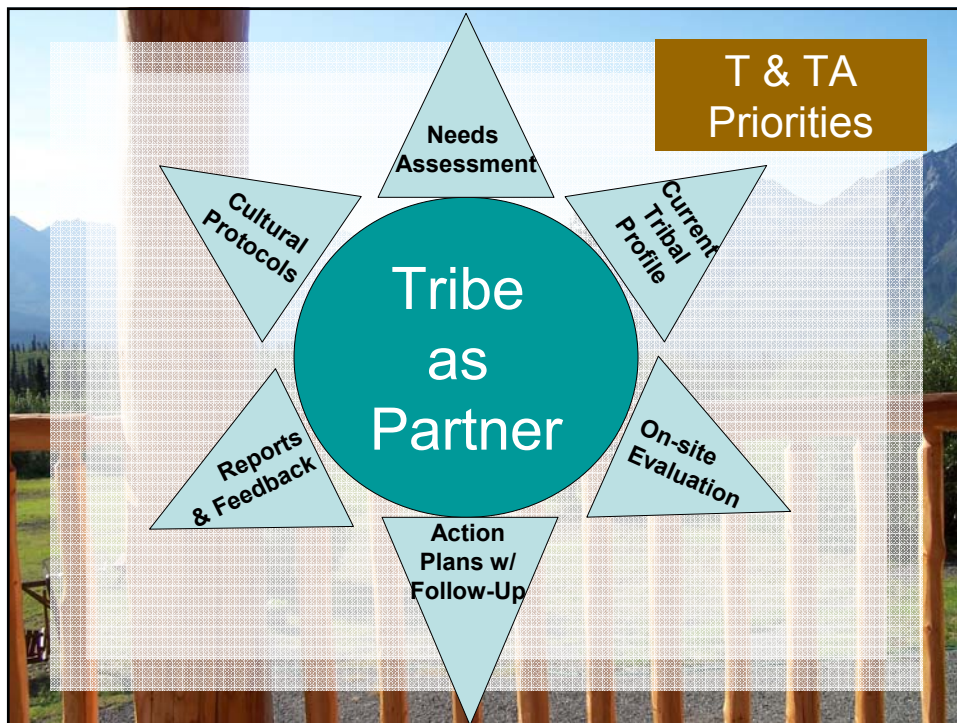
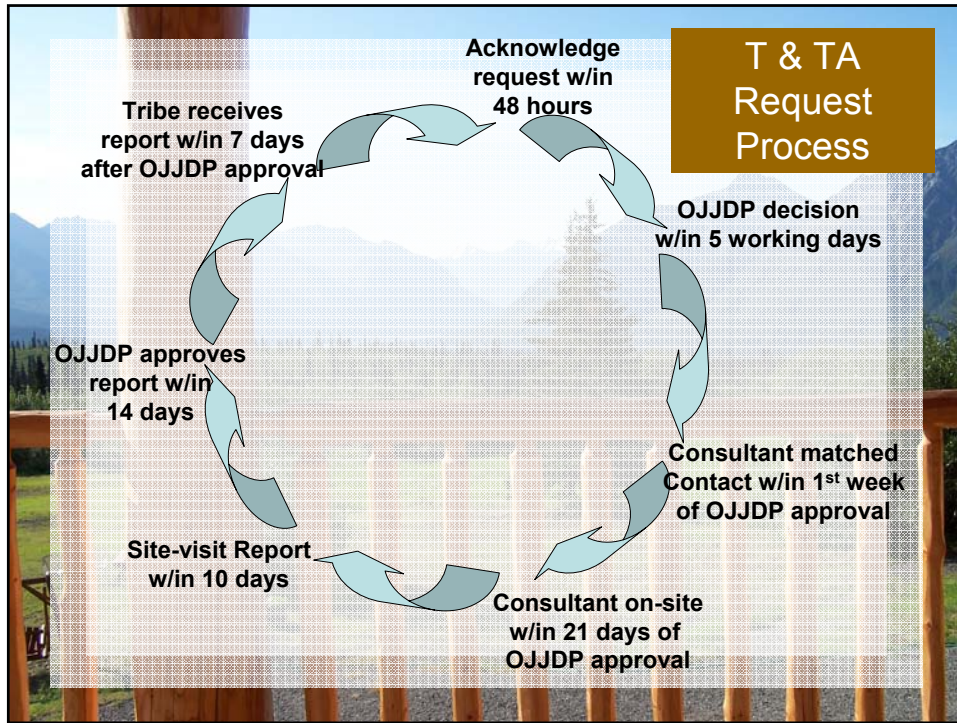
