# <u>Information for Employers Regarding Temporary Protected Status</u>

United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) has announced that Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for individuals from El Salvador has been extended until September 9, 2016. In addition, USCIS automatically extended employment authorization documents (EADs) for these individuals from March 9, 2015 until September 9, 2015. The EADs were extended to allow USCIS enough time to issue new EADs. These automatically extended EADs CANNOT BE REJECTED prior to September 9, 2015. The government announced the extension of TPS in the *Federal Register*, which can be found by visiting www.uscis.gov/tps.

#### Frequently Asked Questions About TPS for El Salvador:

#### 1. How do I know that the EAD is covered by USCIS' automatic extension?

If the EAD expired on March 9, 2015 and if the "Category" field on the EAD is A12 or C19, the individual is covered by the extension of TPS. This is true even if the "Country of Birth" field does not say El Salvador.

#### 2. Do I have to accept the expired EAD?

Yes. Because USCIS has automatically extended work authorization for people with TPS from El Salvador, employers <u>are required to accept</u> the expired EAD as proof of identity and work authorization (a "List A" Form I-9 document) until September 9, 2015. You may violate immigration law if you reject the document.

## 3. Do I need to find out if the employee reapplied for TPS?

No. You should not inquire into the details of your employee's TPS application. You may violate immigration law by requiring an employee to provide proof of his/her reapplication.

This is where the expiration date is located. TPS cards for El Salvador have the expiration date of 03/09/2015.
