


Honors Attorney Experiences





100% have served as lead counsel on a case 46% have done an oral argument before a court 69% participated in a settlement negotiation 62% worked closely with expert witnesses 30% participated in a mediation 15% have taken or defended a deposition

Examples of recent Honors Attorneys' experiences include:

- Worked on a case on the navigability of a remote river in Alaska for title purposes. "My co-counsel, myself, our expert witness, and two agency employees went on a rafting trip on that river. We had to helicopter in and out and rafted and camped for 5 days in remote wilderness, not seeing any signs of human life for the entire trip."
- Drafted a summary judgment brief in a case where over \$350 million was at stake.

- Argued before the DC Circuit in the first six months and wrote appellate briefs in the 9th, 10th, and DC Circuits.
- Represented the Department of Interior, the Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Land Management, Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, Department of Homeland Security, and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.
- Led two settlement negotiations.
