Temporary Board Members

As authorized by 8 C.F.R. § 1003(a)(4), the Director of EOIR may designate immigration judges, retired Board members, retired immigration judges, and current or retired EOIR administrative law judges to act as temporary Board members. With the approval of the Deputy Attorney General, the Director may also designate senior EOIR attorneys who have at least ten years of experience in the field of immigration law. All temporary Board members listed here have been approved by the Deputy Attorney General.

A temporary Board member has the authority of a permanent Board member to adjudicate case assigned to him or her, except that no temporary Board member may vote on any matter decided by the Board en banc, such as the publication of precedent cases.

Molly Kendall Clark

Molly Kendall Clark has served as a Senior Legal Advisor to the Chairman of the BIA since 1995. She received her bachelor of arts from Colorado College in 1974 and her juris doctorate from Suffolk University in 1978. She was an attorney advisor for the BIA from 1978 to 1981 and 1983 to 1991. She worked in the General Counsel's Office of the former Immigration and Naturalization Service from1981 to 1982. She also worked with the immigration periodical *Interpreter Releases* from 1982 to 1983. She is a member of the District of Columbia Bar.

Teresa L. Donovan
