PROPOSED DECISION

Claimant, EDITH F. PESCATELLO, who owned a stock interest in Cuba Bagasse Products, S.A., asserts a claim in the amount of \$157,157.24 under Title V of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended, against the Government of Cuba because of its nationalization of said Company. The amount claimed is asserted as \$97,765 as cost and \$59,392.24 as estimated cost of carrying the shares on loan.

In our decision entitled the <u>Claim of George F. Baker, III</u> (Claim No. CU-1017 which we incorporate herein by reference), we held that the properties owned by the Company were nationalized or otherwise taken by the Government of Cuba on August 3, 1960, and that this type of claim is compensable to an American national under the facts and conditions set forth therein. We need not again detail here the reasons or the method used in determining the value per share of \$2.8607.

On the basis of evidence in the record in the instant case, the Commission finds that this claimant comes within the terms of the <u>Baker</u> decision; that she was an American national at the requisite times; that she has been the owner of 12,000 shares of stock in the Cuban Bagasse Products, S.A. since prior to August 3, 1960; and that she suffered a loss in the amount of \$34,328.40 within the meaning of Title V of the Act. Further, the Commission finds that the amount of loss sustained shall be increased by interest thereon at the rate of 6% per annum from August 3, 1960, the date of loss, to the date on which provisions are made for the settlement thereof. (See Baker, supra.)

No evidence has been submitted to sstablish that any carrying costs incurred by claimant are compensable under Title V of the Act, and this part of the claim is denied.

CERTIFICATION OF LOSS

The Commission certifies that EDITH F. PESCATELLO suffered a loss, is a result of actions of the Government of Cuba, within the scope of Title V of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended in the amount irrty-Four Thousand Three Hundred Twenty-Eight Dollars and Forty Cents \$34,328.40) with interest at 6% per annum from August 3, 1960 to the ate of settlement.

Section 501 of the statute specifically precludes any authorization for appropriations for payment of these claims. The Commission is required to certify its findings to the Secretary of State for possible use in future negotiations with the Government of Cuba.
