ORDER

The matter of defendants' conditions of release was raised at the February 16, 2007 status hearing. At that hearing, the parties agreed to submit a joint proposed order to the Court concerning conditions of release. The parties did so on February 26, 2007. Having considered the terms of the proposed order, the colloquy at the February 16, 2007 hearing, and the entire record in this case, and in light of the agreed-upon nature of the proposed conditions of release, it is hereby

ORDERED that Daniel Bayly, James Brown and Robert Furst, collectively referred to herein as "Defendants," are released on their own recognizance subject to the following conditions:

 Defendants shall not commit any offense in violation of federal, state, or local law while on release in this case.

- 2. Defendants shall immediately advise the Court, defense counsel, and the United States Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Texas of any change in address or telephone number.
- 3. Defendants shall appear at all court proceedings as required and shall surrender for service of any sentence imposed as directed.
- 4. Defendants shall report to Pretrial Services in the Southern District of Texas by telephone no later than three calendar days after the date on which the release order is entered on the docket, and thereafter shall report as directed.
- 5. Defendants shall be permitted to travel within the continental United States without restriction. Defendants may travel with the advanced approval of Pretrial Services to any location outside of the continental United States.
- 6. Defendants shall not possess any firearms, destructive devices or any other dangerous weapons, with the express exception as to Bayly and Furst of those firearms used in recreational, licensed hunting which are registered with the Pretrial Services Officer.

It is further ORDERED that:

- 1. All passports, if any, in the possession of the government or the Pretrial Services

 Office shall be returned forthwith to counsel for the defendant or defendants at issue.
 - 2. All bonds, if any, are exonerated as to the defendants.

It is further ORDERED that all prior orders governing conditions of release as to these defendants are hereby VACATED.
