U.S. Penitentiary (USP) Letcher County, KY will be designed as a 960 bed high security prison with a 256 bed work camp (minimum security). The project will be awarded as a design/build project using a negotiated procurement which allows contractors input on all aspects of the project. USP Letcher County received partial site and planning funds in FY 2006. The FY 2014 President's Budget proposes a rescission to reduce this project by \$3.8 million, leaving \$500,000 in available funding. As a result, an estimated construction completion date cannot be determined for this project due to uncertainty of future funds.

This investment will provide a Federal correctional facility which directly supports the BOP's mission to protect society by confining offenders in the controlled environments of prisons and community-based facilities that are safe, humane, cost-efficient, and appropriately secure, and that provide work and other self-improvement opportunities to assist offenders in becoming law-abiding citizens. It supports the Department of Justice Strategic Goal 3: Ensure and Support the Fair, Impartial, Efficient, and Transparent Administration of Justice at the Federal, State, Local, Tribal and International Levels.
