### A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to carry out the international obligations of the United States under the Geneva Conventions to provide criminal penalties for certain war crimes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "War Crimes Act of
- 5 1996".
- 6 SEC. 2. CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR CERTAIN WAR CRIMES.
- 7 (a) In General.—Title 18, United States Code, is
- 8 amended by inserting after chapter 117 the following:
- 9 **"CHAPTER 118—WAR CRIMES**

"2401. War crimes.

#### 10 **"§ 2401. War crimes**

- 11 "(a) Offense.—Whoever, whether inside or outside
- 12 the United States, commits a grave breach of the Geneva
- 13 Conventions, in any of the circumstances described in sub-
- 14 section (b), shall be fined under this title or imprisoned
- 15 for life or any term of years, or both, and if death results
- 16 to the victim, shall also be subject to the penalty of death.
- 17 "(b) CIRCUMSTANCES.—The circumstances referred
- 18 to in subsection (a) are that the person committing such
- 19 breach or the victim of such breach is a member of the
- 20 armed forces of the United States or a national of the
- 21 United States (as defined in section 101 of the Immigra-
- 22 tion and Nationality Act).
- 23 "(c) Definitions.—As used in this section, the term
- 24 'grave breach of the Geneva Conventions' means conduct
