MOTION TO CLOSE CONFERENCE COMMITTEE MEETINGS ON H.R. 1588, NATIONAL DEFENSE AUTHORIZATION ACT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2004, WHEN CLASSIFIED NATIONAL SECURITY INFORMATION IS UNDER CONSIDERATION.

Mr. Speaker, pursuant to clause 12 of House rule XXII, I move that meetings of the conference between the House and Senate on H.R. 1588 may be closed to the public at such times as classified national security information may be broached, provided that any sitting Member of Congress shall be entitled to attend any meeting of the conference.
