The Partnership for Public Service is offering to agencies an opportunity to participate in the Partnership's new Making the Difference – Federal Internship Program. This program will facilitate 30 paid STEP and SCEP internship positions in acquisition and engineering during the summer of 2009.

The Federal Internship Program is unique because of its emphases on Federal career experience, professional development opportunities, and subsidized housing at the George Washington University. The Partnership will do a first round of vetting based upon two short essays that will help assess the student's commitment to public service and how they handle themselves in a challenging situation. The Partnership will then forward the top applicants to participating agencies to conduct interviews and make final selections.

The Partnership is currently reaching out to agencies to solidify positions. The Department of Justice's (DOJ) participation requires no additional cost in this pilot year beyond the students' salaries, though the partnership will ask DOJ to release the student(s) for professional development programming.
