Spring applications must be received by October 1, 2005  
Summer applications must be received by March 31, 2006  
Fall applications must be received by July 31, 2006

**Minimum Weeks Required:** 8 weeks

**Salary:** Volunteer (without compensation)

**Assignments:** Interns are primarily responsible for assisting Division attorneys or senior specialists in legal research, preparing documents, interviewing, summarizing depositions, analyzing records, and other case-related work.
