PROPOSED DECISION

This is a claim under Section 303(1) of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended, by the AMERICAN UNITARIAN ASSOCIATION, a national of the United States as defined in the Act, for damage to property in Hungary during World War II.

The Commission finds that the claimant was the owner of an undivided one-third interest in a building at Hogyes Endre u.3, Budapest, and in certain movable property contained therein which

was damaged as a result of World War II and for which loss no compensation has been paid by the Government of Hungary. The Commission further finds that the claimant's share of the loss or damage actually sustained amounted to seven thousand two hundred seventy-three dollars and fourteen cents (\$7,273.14) and concludes that claimant is entitled to an award under Section 303(1) of the Act. Under this Section awards are limited to two-thirds of the loss or damage actually sustained.

Pursuant to the provisions of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended, an award is hereby made to the AMERICAN UNITARIAN ASSOCIATION in the amount of four thousand eight hundred forty-eight dollars and seventy-six cents (\$4,848.76).
