PROPOSED DECISION

MARVEL, CHAIRMAN. The claimant seeks the recovery of six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00), the asserted value of personal property alleged to have been taken by the Yugoslavian Government.

The claim is before this Commission upon the proceeding of the Solicitor of the Commission pursuant to Section 300.16 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Commission.

Evidence before the Commission indicates that the claimant became a national of the United States by naturalization in February 1944. Further evidence shows conclusively that the personal property involved in this claim has not been nationalized or taken by the Government of Yugoslavia. This claimant therefore, cannot assert a claim against the fund created by the Yugoslav Claims Agreement of 1948.

The claim is denied in whole.
