PROPOSED DECISION

MARVEL, CHAIRMAN. This claim seeks the recovery of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00), the alleged value of property which it is asserted was nationalized between 1945 and 1947 by the Yugoslav Government.

The claim is before this Commission upon the proceeding of the Solicitor of the Commission pursuant to Section 300.16 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Commission.

Evidence before this Commission shows that the claimant became a citizen of the United States by naturalization on May 26, 1950, and further shows that the property in question was assigned to the claimant by a stateless person on June 8, 1951.

Proposed Decision No. 2 of this Commission, In the Matter of the Claim of DOLORES MOJA MOORE (Y-910), holds that "nationals of the United States" who can assert claims for property nationalized or otherwise taken by the Yugoslav Government is strictly limited to those who were nationals of the United States at the time of the nationalization or other taking occurring between September 1, 1939 and July 19, 1948. This claimant does not come within the limita-

tion of this decision which is binding on the Commission.

The claim is denied in whole.
