AMENDED PROPOSED DECISION

The Commission, on December 19, 1956, issued its Proposed Decision No. SOV-1131 denying the claim herein for the reasons set forth in Proposed Decision No. SOV-230, In the Matter of the Claim of Charles D. Siegel. On May 9, 1957, the Commission (Commissioner Henry J. Clay dissenting), issued its Order No. SOV-230 vacating the Proposed Decision In the Matter of the Claim of Charles D. Siegel, and held that claims based on securities payable in currency other than United States dollars, issued by predecessors of the Soviet Government, are within the purview of Section 305 (a) (2) of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended.

However, the record discloses, that this is a claim against the Soviet Government under Section 305 (a) (2) of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended, for a loss allegedly sustained by the owner of securities issued by the present Soviet Government and payable in currency other than United States dollars.

Section 305(a)(2) of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended by Public Law 285, 81st Congress, provides for the receipt and determination by the Commission of the validity and amounts of claims of nationals of the United States against the Soviet Government, provided such claims arose prior to November 16, 1933.


The Commission's records reflect that the securities upon which this claim is based were issued by the present Soviet Government and were purchased by the claimant in 1935 and in 1940. Evidence submitted by the claimant indicates that coupons were paid as late as 1941. No evidence has been furnished to show, and the Commission is not aware, that such obligations were repudiated by the Soviet Government. In the absence of a repudiation, any claim based upon such securities would not have arisen until after November 16, 1933. Therefore, the Commission finds that this claim is not compensable under the Provisions of the Act and it is hereby, denied.

Other elements bearing upon eligibility and entitlement have not been considered.


