The United States Attorney's Office for the Middle District of Florida and the Center for Public Safety Innovation at St. Petersburg College are pleased to announce that the Project Safe Neighborhoods Violent Gang and Gun Crime Reduction Program will conduct a two day class on Gang Wiretaps: Title III Intercept of Secure Communications. The training is being hosted by the Cape Coral Police Department. There are no fees or costs to attend the training.

This tuition-free sixteen-hour course is designed for law enforcement officers, investigators, analysts, tech agents, and prosecuting attorneys and highlights the use of wiretaps as an investigative tool in investigations targeting criminal street gang organizations. Students will receive in-depth instruction regarding the legal requirements of conducting a wiretap investigation, developing a pre-wiretap investigative plan and strategy, drafting affidavits and all other electronic intercept orders needed in the investigation, the techniques and goals of the actual wiretap unique to gang investigations, the importance and functionality of spin wiretaps, and take-down day goals which further the prosecution of the entire organization.
