## **ORDER OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION**

Upon consideration of the stipulation for entry of an order of permanent injunction entered between the United States of America and John Waszczak, and filed with the Court on April 17, 2009 (doc # 2):

It is hereby ordered that, pursuant to 26 U.S.C. §§ 7402, 7407, and 7408 and Rule 65 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, John Waszczak, and his representatives, agents, servants, employees, and anyone acting in concert or participation with him who receives actual notice of this order, are **PERMANENTLY ENJOINED**, individually and through any entity from directly or indirectly

- a) Preparing or assisting in the preparation of any federal tax return for any person other than himself;
- b) Advising, counseling, or instructing any person about the preparation of a federal tax return;
- c) Filing, or assisting in the filing of a federal income tax returns for any person other than himself;
- d) Owning, managing, controlling, working for, or volunteering for a tax-returnpreparation business;
- e) Representing persons in connection with any matter before the IRS; and
- f) Engaging in other similar conduct that substantially interferes with the administration and enforcement of the internal revenue laws.

It is further ordered that Waszczak shall mail a copy of this injunction and a copy of the complaint to all persons or entities for whom he has prepared federal tax returns, amended

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returns, or other federal tax documents or forms since January 1, 2006. Waszczak must mail the

copies within 30 days of the date of this order of permanent injunction and must file with the

Court a sworn certificate stating that he has complied with this requirement. This mailing shall

include a cover letter in a form either agreed to by counsel for the government or approved by the

Court, and shall not include any other documents or enclosures.

It is further ordered that Waszczak shall produce to counsel for the government within

fifteen days of the date of this order of permanent injunction a list of every person or entity for

whom he has prepared (or helped to prepare) a federal tax return since January 1, 2006, and set

forth on said list their names, addresses, e-mail addresses, telephone numbers and social security

numbers or tax identification numbers.

Finally, it is ordered that the Court shall retain jurisdiction to enforce this injunction and

the government may engage in post-judgment discovery to monitor defendant's compliance with

this injunction.

It is so ordered.
