**THREE INDICTED BY FEDERAL GRAND JURY FOR  
CONSPIRACY TO DISTRIBUTE METHAMPHETAMINE**

Anchorage, Alaska – Acting United States Attorney Kevin Feldis announced today, September 16, 2009, that Amy Renee Itta, Nanasi Kalala Satini and Toupo Satini, all of Anchorage, Alaska, were indicted by a federal grand jury in Anchorage for one count of conspiracy with the intent to distribute methamphetamine.

The indictment named Amy Renee Itta, age 23, Nanasi Kalala Satini, age 24, and Toupo Satini, age 31, as the only defendants.

According to the indictment, Itta and the Satinis are alleged to have conspired to ship over 500 grams of methamphetamine via Federal Express to Anchorage for the purpose of distribution.

Assistant United States Attorney Jack S. Schmidt, who presented the case to the grand jury, indicated that the law provides for a maximum sentence of life in prison and fines totaling up to \$4,000,000.

The defendants have been detained since their arrest on September 9, 2009.

The Alaska Bureau of Alcohol and Drug Enforcement -- Alaska Interdiction Task Force conducted the investigation leading to the indictment in this case.

An indictment is only a charge and is not evidence of guilt. A defendant is presumed innocent and is entitled to a fair trial at which the government must prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
