CRENSHAW COUNTY MAN'S FEDERAL PROBATIONARY SENTENCE REVOKED

Rapist Revoked

MONTGOMERY, ALABAMA — Jerry Lee Davis, of Brantley, Alabama, had his federal probationary sentence revoked for committing a new crime while on federal supervised release, U.S. Attorney Leura G. Canary announced today.

On July 14, 2006, Jerry Lee Davis was sentenced in the Middle District of Alabama after pleading guilty to being a Felon in Possession of a Firearm. Davis received a sentence of 60 months probation. On November 8, 2006, Davis was arrested by the Crenshaw County Sheriff's Department on charges that he raped his, then, thirteen year-old step-daughter.

On April 21, 2008, Davis pled guilty to Rape, First Degree, in the Circuit Court of Crenshaw County, Alabama, and was sentenced to a term of imprisonment of 20 years, suspended, to serve three years, followed by three years probation.

On November 6, 2008, before United States District Court Judge Mark E. Fuller, Davis admitted that he violated the terms of his federal probation. Judge Fuller revoked Davis' probation and ordered him to serve 7 years in the custody of the Federal Bureau of Prisons to be followed by a three-year term of supervised release. Judge Fuller further ordered that the federal sentence be served consecutive to the state rape sentence. Davis is expected to complete his three-year sentence with the state before beginning his federal sentence.

The case was investigated by the Crenshaw County Sheriff's Department and the United States Office of Probation.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Susan R. Redmond.
