INDICTMENT RETURNED
CHARGING LOCAL MAN WITH ILLEGAL POSSESSION OF A FIREARM AFTER
CONVICTION OF THREE FELONIES

Mobile, AL - A one-count indictment was returned today by a Federal Grand Jury against Timothy Tremayne Pugh, 29 years old, a Mobile area resident. Pugh was charged with possessing a .357 caliber revolver after being convicted in 2001 of three felonies, namely Robbery 1st Degree, Attempted Burglary 2nd Degree and Receiving Stolen Property 2nd Degree.

Chickasaw and Saraland Police Departments investigated the case and presented it to the U.S. Attorney's Office for prosecution. The prosecutor assigned to the case is Assistant United States Attorney, Gina S. Vann.

An indictment is a determination by a grand jury that there is probable cause to believe that an offense has been committed by a defendant. A defendant, of course, is presumed innocent until and unless he or she is proven guilty at trial.
