## **FORMER ARIZ. ARMY SOLDIER SENTENCED TO PRISON FOR VIOLATING FEDERAL PROBATION**

TUCSON, Ariz. – Glenn Bernard Smith, II, 28, of Elyria, Ohio, was sentenced here today by U.S. District Chief Judge John M. Roll to five years in federal prison. Smith admitted on May 13, 2009, that he violated his probation by failing to report his October 25, 2008, contact with law enforcement to his federal probation officer.

While serving as a U.S. Army soldier assigned to Fort Huachuca, Ariz., Smith was sentenced to five years probation on November 15, 2006, after being convicted of Possession with Intent to Distribute Cocaine. While serving his supervised probation in Ohio, he was to report any contact with law enforcement as one of the conditions imposed by the federal court. On October 25, 2008, Smith had contact with officers from the Elyria, Ohio, Police Department and failed to report that to his federal probation officer.

The investigation in this case was conducted by the Northern District of Ohio Pretrial Services and Probation Office and the U.S. Probation Office in the District of Arizona with assistance from the Elyria Police Department. The prosecution was handled by Sandra M. Hansen, Assistant U.S. Attorney, District of Arizona, Tucson.
