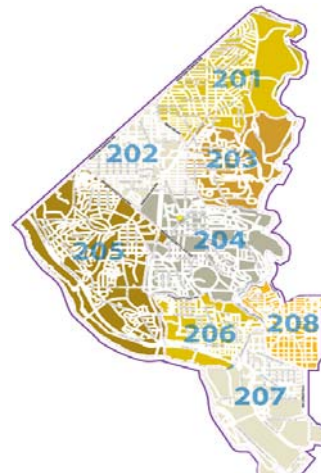
Tony Harris, 53, of District Heights, Maryland, pled guilty to Unlawful Possession with Intent to Distribute 100 Grams or More Heroin.

A federal grand jury in the District of Columbia has returned a seven-count indictment charging James Wenneker Von Brunn, 89, of Annapolis, Maryland, with the murder of Special Police Officer Stephen Tyrone Johns and related hate crime and gun charges for his alleged attack on the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum on June 10, 2009.

THE COURT REPORT

There are no press releases for the month of July.

DISTRICT COURT CASES

Seth Gulley, 29, of Greenfield, Indiana, was sentenced on July 6, 2009, before the Honorable Richard W. Roberts of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia, to a period of 72 months incarceration. Gulley pled guilty to Transportation of Child Pornography and Possessing Material Constituting Child Pornography on October 16, 2008. Judge Roberts also ordered that Gulley be placed on supervised release for 30 years upon completion of his prison sentence. Gulley's supervision will include numerous requirements, including registration as a sex offender, and limitations on access to and contact with minors, computers, and the internet.

FACTS: According to the Statement of Offense filed by the government, on October 12, 2007, an undercover detective with the District of Columbia Metropolitan Police Department, posing as an adult pedophile, registered to gain access to, and subsequently monitored, a known child pornography site. On October 31, 2007, the detective utilized a covert screen name and posted a message in the public access forum in the site for anyone in Virginia, Maryland, West Virginia or the District of Columbia, who was active and wanted to chat.

On November 15, 2007, the detective was contacted by an individual who utilized the screen name "wolfhall_yng1" who initiated a conversation through instant messaging. During that conversation the detective was informed by "wolfhall_yng1" that he was chatting with another pedophile in Yahoo! who was utilizing the screen name "daddee_luvs_yng_girls". That same day, the detective, utilizing a covert screen name, initiated contact in Yahoo! instant message with the defendant, who utilized the screen name "daddee_luvs_yng_girls", and also identified himself as "Seth."

The defendant described himself as a 28-year-old white male residing in Indiana. During the course of communications between the detective and the defendant between November 15, 2007, and May 22, 2008, the defendant sent the detective by photo share approximately fourteen (14) files containing images depicting children who appear to be under the age of 12 engaged in suggestive posing and in sexual acts with adults.

In conversations with the detective the defendant said that he lived with his father. Moreover, the defendant routinely displayed a color photograph of himself in his profile box during the course of these communications with the detective. During all of these communications, the detective was at a location within the District of Columbia. Subsequent investigation determined that the defendant resided with his father in Greenfield, Indiana.

On June 3, 2008, the defendant was arrested in Greenfield, Indiana, pursuant to a warrant for his arrest that was issued by a U.S. District Court Magistrate Judge for the District of Columbia on May 22, 2008. On June 2, 2008, a U.S. District Court Magistrate Judge for the Southern District

of Indiana issued a search warrant authorizing the search of the defendant's residence. The warrant was executed by Metropolitan Police Department Detectives and Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Among the items recovered during the search of the defendant's home was a HP Pavillion Computer. A forensic analysis of that computer was conducted by a Criminal Investigator with the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia. On the computer were 303 images of child pornography, including the 14 images of child pornography that the defendant had sent to the detective, and 8 video-sequenced movies/images of child pornography, as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 2256. The images located on the defendant's computer were taken to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) and have been compared with NCMEC's Child Recognition & Identification System (CRIS).

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood and the Regional Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force. In February 2006, the Attorney General created Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative designed to protect children from online exploitation and abuse. Led by the U.S. Attorney's Offices, Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as identify and rescue victims. Statement From the United States Attorney's Office

Following a review of the evidence relating to stalking allegations against Marion Barry and a careful analysis of the relevant factors, including the elements of the offense and the strengths and weaknesses of the evidence, the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia has decided not to pursue stalking charges in this matter.

Tony Harris, 53, of District Heights, Maryland, pled guilty to Unlawful Possession with Intent to Distribute 100 Grams or More Heroin.

FACTS: According to evidence presented at the plea hearing, on March 4, 2008, at approximately 5:00 p.m., while at the intersection of 6th & Florida Ave, NE, Washington, D.C., MPD Officers Wayne David and Danny Walker, along with ATF Agent Shawn Arthur, were in a marked scout car when they observed Harris run a red traffic light while driving southbound on 6th Street, NE, in a gold Mercedes. Officer David conducted a traffic stop and asked the defendant for his driver's license, proof of insurance, and registration.

While providing the documents to Officer David, the defendant began to stutter and act nervously. As Officer David was conducting a WALES check of the defendant's information, Officer Walker noticed that the defendant's hands were shaking as he started to eat crackers and drink cranberry juice in his car. At this point, the defendant was asked to step out of his car

because he appeared ill, and Officer Walker asked the defendant, "Are you ok?" The defendant paused for a moment and then fled from the officers, abandoning his vehicle in the street. Officer David pursued the defendant for several blocks in high traffic. However, the defendant escaped after running across six lanes of traffic on Florida Avenue, NE.

Subsequently, the vehicle was secured and an inventory search of the vehicle was conducted. On the front passenger side floorboard was a brown paper bag that contained a clear plastic ziplock bag. This ziplock bag contained 3 bundles of a compressed brown powder substance wrapped in clear plastic. The contents of these bundles was tested by a DEA chemist and found to contain 184.6 grams of heroin. Moreover, inside the trunk of the vehicle was a cardboard box containing \$57,750.00 in cash. Mail matter was removed from the passenger compartment bearing the defendant's name and address. An arrest warrant was issued for the defendant's arrest, and he was subsequently arrested several weeks later.

Seven Trinidadian nationals were convicted of hostage-taking resulting in the death of U.S. citizen Balram Maharaj in 2005. The Trinidadian defendants were convicted after a ten-week jury trial before the Honorable John D. Bates in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia. The defendants face a mandatory sentence of life imprisonment without the possibility of release under the hostage-taking statute; the United States did not to seek the death penalty against them. A sentencing date has not yet been set. The convicted Trinidadian nationals included Wayne Pierre, also known as "Ninja," Kevin Nixon, also known as "Shaka," Christopher Sealey, also known as Christopher Bourne and "Boyie," and Anderson Straker, also known as "Gypsy's Son," Ricardo De Four, Zion Clarke, and Kevon Demerieux, also known as "Ketchit.

FACTS: According to evidence presented at trial, in April 2005, the victim, Balram Maharaj, a naturalized American citizen of Trinidadian heritage, returned to his native country to visit his family. On April 6, 2005, Maharaj was seized by armed gunmen as he sat relaxing at a bar. Maharaj, 61, suffered from poor health and was held hostage under very harsh conditions. He was deprived of essential medications, while his abductors demanded ransom from his family for his release. Maharaj died in captivity, and his dismembered and badly decomposed body was located by authorities in a remote area of Trinidad on January 8, 2006.

A federal grand jury in the District of Columbia has returned a seven-count indictment charging James Wenneker Von Brunn, 89, of Annapolis, Maryland, with the murder of Special Police Officer Stephen Tyrone Johns and related hate crime and gun charges for his alleged attack on the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum on June 10, 2009.

FACTS: The indictment stems from the defendant's alleged attack on the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum on June 10, 2009, resulting in the shooting death of Special Police Officer Stephen Tyrone Johns. The indictment also charges Von Brunn with federal civil rights and hate crimes violations and District of Columbia Code offenses under the District's murder,

firearms and hate-crimes statutes for his alleged attack on the individuals inside the museum at the time of the shooting.

In announcing the indictment, Acting United States Attorney for the District of Columbia Channing Phillips, Acting Assistant Attorney General for the Civil Rights Division Loretta King, Assistant Director in Charge of the FBI's Washington Field Office Joseph Persichini, Jr., and Metropolitan Police Department Chief Cathy L. Lanier commended the excellent investigative work of the FBI agents and MPD detectives assigned to the case. The case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorneys Nicole Waid and Vinet Bryant and Trial Attorney Ed Chung of the DOJ Civil Rights Division. Trial Attorney Bill Narus of the DOJ Counterterrorism Section provided substantial assistance in the investigation of this case.

If convicted, the defendant faces a maximum sentence of life imprisonment. Four of the counts in the indictment also are death penalty eligible.

The charges contained in the indictment are merely allegations. The defendant is presumed innocent until and unless found guilty in a court of law.

A Former U.S. Foreign Service Officer, Michael John O'Keefe, Sr., 62, of Portsmouth, New Hampshire, and an international jeweler, Sunil Agrawal, 50, of New York, New York, were sentenced before the Honorable Paul L. Friedman today on related charges. O'Keefe, a 22-year veteran of the State Department was employed at the U.S. Consulate in Toronto, Canada, as the Deputy Non-Immigrant Visa Chief. He pled guilty to one count of accepting an illegal gratuity on February 25, 2009. O'Keefe was sentenced to twelve months and one day of incarceration, to be followed by one year of supervised release, and ordered to forfeit \$5000 worth of cash and jewelry. Agrawal, who is the Chief Executive Officer of STS Jewels, Inc., an international manufacturer and distributor of semi-precious gems with offices in New York and worldwide, pled guilty to one count of supplementing the salary of O'Keefe on February 25, 2009. Agrawal was sentenced to a \$100,000 fine, and 18 months of supervised probation, to include 100 hours of community service, among other conditions. The \$100,000, fine which represents one of the largest fines imposed in this District for this offense, has already been paid by Agrawal.

FACTS: According to the evidence presented before and during the sentencing hearing, from before February 1, 2004, and continuing through August 18, 2006, O'Keefe received and accepted from Agrawal round trip airline tickets between Toronto, Canada, and Las Vegas for O'Keefe and exotic dancers; hotel accommodations and expenses in New York for O'Keefe and two of the exotic dancers; and hotel accommodations and expenses in Las Vegas for O'Keefe and three exotic dancers; jewelry; expensive meals; and entertainment. O'Keefe scheduled expedited interviews for and issued visas to 21 persons sponsored by STS Jewels.

Agrawal provided the above listed items as supplementation of O'Keefe's salary.

In announcing his sentences, the Court recognized the public trust that was violated by O'Keefe's actions as a public official and the harm to the reputation of the State Department.

Donna Jean Ishmell, 48, of the District of Columbia, was sentenced before the Honorable Henry H. Kennedy, Jr., to eight months in prison following her earlier guilty plea on June 2, 2008, to one count of Wire Fraud. The defendant was also ordered to serve three years of supervised release following her release from prison, and to pay \$5,235 in restitution and a \$100 special assessment.

FACTS: According to the Statement of Offense filed with the Court by the government, between March 2005 and June 2005, defendant Donna Jean Ishmell engaged in a scheme to defraud the Progressive Casualty Insurance Company ("Progressive") by submitting a false and fraudulent insurance claim following an automobile collision. On March 14, 2005, the defendant, using the name and date of birth of her daughter, Dana Greene, rented a 2005 Buick LaSabre from Enterprise Rent-A-Car in Arlington, Virginia. She presented to the rental agent a fraudulently obtained Virginia driver's license bearing her photograph and Dana Greene's name, date of birth, and social security number. The defendant designated Derrick Ishmell as an authorized driver for the vehicle. On March 20, 2005, Ms. Ishmell's co-defendant, William Steve Ishmell, was involved in a motor vehicle collision in the District of Columbia while driving the vehicle rented on March 14, 2005. He falsely represented himself as Derrick Ishmell to others at the scene of the collision. The collision involved Mr. Ishmell and a motorist insured by Progressive.

On March 21, 2005, defendant Donna Jean Ishmell, falsely using the name Dana Greene, reported the collision to Enterprise Rent-A-Car. By their actions, the defendants caused several interstate wire communications to be made in connection with the claim to Progressive, including an April 5, 2005, telephone call between a Progressive claims adjustor in Virginia and the Metropolitan Police Department in the District of Columbia.

In support the false insurance claim, the defendants jointly prepared a letter that was submitted to Progressive bearing letterhead in the name of Eureka Van & Storage Co., Inc. This letter falsely stated that Derrick Ishmell was employed by the company in March and April 2005, working an average of 40 hours per week and 10 hours of overtime per week, and earning \$17.50 per hour. Defendant Donna Jean Ishmell signed the letter using the name of Dana Greene, falsely representing that Dana Greene was a representative of Eureka Van & Storage Co., Inc. The letter falsely stated that Derrick Ishmell had incurred \$3,850 in lost wages due to the accident of March 20, 2005. Neither Donna Jean Ishmell, Dana Greene, William Steve Ishmell, nor Derrick Ishmell were employed by Eureka Van & Storage Co., Inc. during the period claimed in the letter.

In June 2005, Progressive paid \$6,000 to co-defendant William Steve Ishmell, believing him to be Derrick Ishmell, in settlement of his insurance claim arising from the March 20, 2005, motor vehicle collision. In sentencing defendant Donna Ishmell, the Court also considered evidence of

numerous other fraudulent insurance claims that she had filed using her daughter's identity, as well as evidence that she had fraudulently obtained Social Security Administration benefits using her daughter's identity.

The defendant's husband, co-defendant William Steve Ishmell, has pleaded guilty to one count of Aggravated Identity Theft for his involvement in their fraud scheme. In October 2008, he was sentenced to two years of incarceration, one year of supervised release, and an order to pay restitution.
