**BREVARD COUNTY MAN ARRESTED**  
**ON FEDERAL CHILD PORNOGRAPHY CHARGES**

Orlando, Florida - United States Attorney Robert E. O'Neill announced today that Samuel Langfitt (72, Cocoa Beach) was arrested by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's (ICE) Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) on a criminal complaint for distribution and possession of child pornography.

If indicted on distribution and possession of child pornography, Langfitt will face a mandatory minimum of 5 years and up to 20 years in federal prison for each count of distribution of child pornography and a \$250,000 fine. Additionally, he will face a maximum of 10 years in federal prison and a \$250,000 fine for possession of child pornography.

Following his initial appearance, Langfitt was temporarily detained pending the return of an indictment. An indictment is merely a formal charge that a defendant has committed a violation of the federal criminal laws, and every defendant is presumed innocent unless, and until, proven guilty.

This case was investigated by the Brevard Sheriff's County Office, Bergen County Prosecutor's Office (New Jersey) and ICE HSI. It is being prosecuted by Special Assistant United States Attorney Myrna Amelia Mesa.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. Led by United States Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS), Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state, and local resources to better locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims.
