Davenport Man Sentenced to 60 Months Imprisonment for Arson and Firearm Offenses

DAVENPORT, IA – On August 9, 2012, Cordell Lashell McDowell, age 24, of

Davenport, Iowa, was sentenced to 60 months imprisonment, having previously pleaded guilty to

arson and possession of a firearm as a felon, announced United States Attorney Nicholas A.

Klinefeldt. United States District Judge John A. Jarvey also sentenced McDowell to three years

supervised release following imprisonment.

On Monday, November 7, 2011, McDowell and two confederates kicked in the door of an

apartment on Heatherton Drive in Davenport, Iowa. McDowell acted as a lookout as a couch and

bed were set on fire in the apartment. McDowell also attempted to light the bathroom carpet on

fire. The apartment building contained six separate units, all of which were rented at the time of

the fire. Three days before the fire, McDowell had been in possession of two firearms. Since

McDowell had previously been convicted of a felony offense, he was prohibited from possessing

firearms.

The case was investigated by the Davenport, Iowa, Police Department, the Bureau of

Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, and it was prosecuted by the United States

Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Iowa.
