- 1. Your affiant, Charles Edward Bonser, being duly sworn, does depose and state as follows:
- 2. I am a Special Agent (SA) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). I have been a Special Agent of the FBI since December 2010. I am currently assigned to the Bemidji, Minnesota Resident Agency of the FBI with the primary responsibility of investigating violent crimes that occur on the Red Lake Indian Reservation.
- 3. The facts and information contained in this Affidavit are based on my training, experience, observations, and personal knowledge; upon my discussions with other law enforcement officers and agents directly involved in this investigation; and upon my review of official reports submitted in relation to this investigation.
- 4. This Affidavit does not contain all facts known to me regarding these matters, but only those sufficient to support a finding of probable cause for the requested warrant.
- 5. On July 4, 2013, at approximately 4:22 a.m., Red Lake Police Department (RLPD) officers were dispatched to the scene of a stabbing at the Byron James Lussier residence, located on the Red Lake Indian Reservation.
- 6. When officers arrived, they found Byron James Lussier, Indian male, date of birth XX/XX/1962, lying on the floor with multiple stab wounds.

- 8. Witness 1 was interviewed on July 4, 2013, by RLPD
 Criminal Investigator Geoffrey Pierre. Witness 1
 advised he/she was at the residence of Byron
 James Lussier when the stabbing occurred, along with
 Witness 2 and Witness 3. Witness 1 stated that Alison
 Ann Brown, Indian female, date of birth XX/XX/1988,
 was also present.
- 9. Witness 1 advised that he/she heard Alison Ann Brown say something to Byron James Lussier and then Brown began physically fighting with Byron James Lussier.
- 10. Witness 2 was interviewed by FBI SA Charles E. Bonser and Criminal Investigator Geoffrey Pierre on July 4, 2013. Witness 2 observed Alison Ann Brown arm herself with a heavy duty grilling fork. Witness 2 was able to take the fork away from Alison Ann Brown. Witness 2 then threw the fork on the floor against the wall.
- 11. Witness 2 advised that Alison Ann Brown then armed herself with a large kitchen knife with a brown handle. Alison Ann Brown stabbed Byron James Lussier multiple times. Witness 2 took the knife away from Alison Ann Brown and dropped it on the floor.
- 12. Witness 2 advised Alison Ann Brown next armed herself with a smaller knife, similar to the size of a pocket knife.
- 13. Witness 2 advised that Byron James Lussier collapsed on the floor.
- 14. Witness 3 was interviewed by Criminal Investigator
 Geoffrey Pierre on July 4, 2013. Witness 3 said
 he/she grabbed Alison Ann Brown and forced her from

- the Byron James Lussier residence after Byron James Lussier collapsed on the floor.
- 15. Witnesses reported that Alison Ann Brown fled on foot to her residence located at 23838 Back of Town Drive, approximately four houses down the street from the Byron James Lussier residence.
- 16. Alison Ann Brown was located by the Red Lake Police
 Department at her residence and arrested at
 approximately 4:40 a.m.
- 17. While processing the crime scene at the Byron James
 Lussier residence, your affiant located a heavy duty
 grilling fork on the floor against the wall between
 the kitchen and living room. Your affiant also located
 a large kitchen knife with a brown handle on the
 kitchen table. The knife appeared to have a bloodlike substance on it.
- 18. During the execution of a federal search warrant at the residence of Alison Ann Brown, a small kitchen knife was located on a couch near the front door of the residence.
- 19. I know that Alison Ann Brown and Byron James Lussier are both enrolled members of the Red Lake Band of Chippewa Indians.
- 20. Based upon the above information, I believe that there is probable cause to believe that Alison Ann Brown, Indian female, date of birth XX/XX/1988, did commit the offense of the unlawful killing of Byron James Lussier, Indian male, date of birth XX/XX/1962, which occurred within the exterior boundaries of the Red Lake Indian Reservation, Minnesota, a location within the special territorial jurisdiction of the United
