RONALD CHAMBERS, a/k/a "Quil Brown" Magistrate No. 11-6511

I, Douglas Man, the undersigned complainant being duly sworn, state the following is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief. On or about October 7, 2010 in Essex County, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, defendant:

having been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Essex County, did knowingly possess in and affecting commerce three loaded firearms, namely: (1) a Winchester 12-gauge shotgun bearing serial number L2711151, loaded with five live rounds and one spent round of ammunition; (2) a Stallard 9-millimeter semi-automatic handgun bearing serial number 083648, loaded with six live rounds of ammunition; and (3) an Ithaca .45-caliber semi-automatic handgun bearing serial number 2079588, loaded with three live rounds of ammunition, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(g)(1).

I further state that I am a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and that this complaint is based on the following facts:

## ATTACHMENT A

- I, Douglas Man, am a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Based upon my investigation and my discussions with other individuals involved in this investigation, I have knowledge of the facts which appear below. Where statements of others are set forth herein, these statements are related in substance and in part. Since this Criminal Complaint is being submitted for a limited purpose, I have not set forth every fact that I know or other law enforcement officers know concerning this investigation. I have only set forth those facts that I believe are sufficient to show probable cause exists to believe that the defendant committed the offense set forth herein. Where I assert that an event took place on a particular date, I am asserting that it took place on or about the date alleged.
- 1. On or about October 7, 2010, Newark police officers executed an arrest warrant for Defendant RONALD CHAMBERS (hereinafter "CHAMBERS") for a carjacking that occurred on July 10, 2010. Officers executing the warrant knocked on the door to CHAMBERS residence in Newark, New Jersey, and a woman who identified herself as CHAMBERS' mother let them into the residence. The woman informed officers that CHAMBERS was downstairs in the basement. Officers then announced their presence and entered the basement.
- 2. When officers went into the basement, they found CHAMBERS hiding in a crawlspace. CHAMBERS was holding a duffel bag that had the barrel of a shotgun sticking out of it. The duffel bag was found to contain the following firearms: a Winchester Model 1300 Pump Shotgun bearing serial number L2711151 loaded with five live rounds and one spent round of ammunition within the chamber; a Stallard 9-millimeter semi-automatic handgun bearing serial number 083648 loaded with six live rounds of ammunition; and an Ithaca .45 caliber semi-automatic handgun bearing serial number 2079588 loaded with three live rounds of ammunition.
- 3. The firearms CHAMBERS possessed, as set forth in paragraphs 1 through 2 above, are all weapons which will, are designed to, or may readily be converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive, within the meaning of 18 U.S.C. § 921(a)(3).
- 4. Testing performed on the firearms CHAMBERS possessed confirmed that all three were fully operational. Additionally, a firearms trace summary confirmed that all of these firearms were manufactured and/or have traveled outside the State of New Jersey.
- 5. A search of CHAMBERS' criminal history reveals that he has eight prior felony convictions. Included within that number is a conviction in the Superior Court of New Jersey for Possession of Controlled Dangerous Substances with intent to Distribute within a School Zone in violation of New Jersey Statutes Annotated Section 2C:35-7, for which CHAMBERS was sentenced to three years imprisonment on November 3, 2008.
