Claudia Kearney observed Keith Anthony Wright dancing in the boarding area. She

wright to the airport bar, where she stopped him to speak to him. Wright told her that he had drunk one beer. However, she did not smell any alcohol on him, and, based on her conversation with him, she determined that he was not drunk and that he was well enough to travel. Kearney told Wright that he should not have any more alcohol, and she further followed him onto the plane when he boarded and advised the head flight attendant that Wright should not be served alcohol in flight.

3. Onboard U.S. Airways Flight 704, en route from Salt Lake City to Los Angeles International, Keith Wright, seated in 26E, completely removed his clothing and tossed the clothing into the row in front of him. He further refused to secure his seatbelt and was unresponsive to repeated attempts by Senior Flight Attendant Renee L. Tate to communicate with him. Tate instructed Wright to dress himself and he did not respond. She further attempted to cover Wright with a blanket, however, Wright threw the blanket off. Tate then requested the assistance of some aircraft passengers to help her restrain Wright, including Los Angeles Police Officer Brent Hirunpugdi and Deputy Stephanie Sparks, of the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department. Wright punched and kicked Tate and the passengers assisting her while they handcuffed him and secured him to his seat. One of the passengers assisting Tate received severe bruising to his arm during this struggle. After the plane landed in Albuquerque, Wright was taken into custody by Albuquerque Aviation Police.

4. In a subsequent interview with SAs of the FBI, Wright advised that he was bipolar and that he had not taken his prescribed medication, Divalproex, that morning before leaving New York. He stated that he recalled nothing of the flight nor of his reported behavior.
