The information set forth in this affidavit 20 was derived from my own investigation and/or communicated to 21 me by other sworn law enforcement officers, including 22 Sergeant Steve Chavez and Officer Greg Concho, Pueblo of 23 Laguna Police Department (LPD), and Criminal Investigator 24 (CI) Fran Flores, Pueblo of Acoma Police Department (APD). 25 26 Information was received from LPD that Jane Doe, an 2. 27 enrolled member of the Pueblo of Laguna, year of birth 1996,

was the victim of an sexual abuse of a minor, in that Alexander Frank Torivio, an enrolled member of the Pueblo of Acoma, year of birth 1986, had sexual intercourse with Doe on multiple occasions, including once in or about April, 2009, and once in or about October, 2009. In April, 2009, Doe was twelve (12) years old and Torivo was twenty-three (23) years old. In October, 2009, Doe was thirteen (13) years old and Torivio was twenty-three (23) years old.

3. Initial reports of the sexual relationship between Doe and Torivio were obtained from Brain Vallo. Vallo, who was in LPD custody in another matter, reported that Doe disclosed to him that she was having sexual intercourse with Alex (last name unknown), who was in his twenties. Vallo also reported that Alex worked for the Pueblo of Laguna Schools.

4. Doe was interviewed by Sergeant Chavez and Officer Concho on March 18, 2010, and by SA McCaskill and Officer Concho on April 8, 2010. Doe identified Alex as Alexander Torivio. Doe met Torivio through Project Venture, a field-based science instruction program which employs Torivio. Doe disclosed that she and Torivio began having sexual intercourse after both went on a snow-boarding trip with Project Venture in February, 2009. During both interviews, Doe disclosed that Torivio had sexual intercourse with her on multiple occasions sometime between February, 2009 and November, 2009.

5. Doe disclosed that, in or about February, 2009, possibly a couple of months after the snow-boarding trip in February, 2009, she sneaked out of her home and Torivio picked her up in his vehicle, which she described as a blue sedan. Torivio drove to an unidentified location on Old Seama Road, near her home, which is located at Unit #111, 20 South View Loop, Pueblo of Laguna, New Mexico. Torivio parked the vehicle and had sexual intercourse with her in the vehicle. Doe indicated that the two had sex with each other with their pants pulled down. This location is in Cibola County and is within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo of Laguna Indian Reservation.

5. Doe disclosed that, in or about November, 2009, she sneaked out of her home and Torivio picked her up in his vehicle, which she described as a blue sedan. Torivio drove to an uninhabited home near his home. Torivio took her inside the uninhabited home and had sexual intercourse with her on a bed in the building. Doe indicated that the two had sex with each other with their pants pulled down. Doe later identified an uninhabited home located at #9 Haaku Road, Pueblo of Acoma, New Mexico, a the home to which Torivio took her that night. The uninhabited home is owned by Jackie Torivio and is located next door to Torivio's residence, #7 Haaku Road, Pueblo of Acoma, New Mexico. This location is in Cibola County and is within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo of Acoma Indian Reservation.

On April 16, 2010, Torivio presented himself at the Laguna Middle School (LMS) for an interview. Torivio arrived in a blue Kia, four-door sedan. New Mexico Department of Motor Vehicle records indicate that a 2004 blue, 4-door Kia, New Mexico license plate HAAKU, VIN KNAFE121345064305, is registered to Torivio at #7 Haaku Road, Pueblo of Acoma, New Mexico, 87034.

8. On April 8, 2010, SA McCaskill interviewed Mary Evon Mooney, mother of Doe. Mooney indicated that, about one year ago, she found her daughter missing from her room.

Mooney went to check on her daughter at about 3:00 am because there was cold air coming from her room. Mooney found Doe's door locked. Mooney, who had a key to the room, opened the door and found Doe missing from the room and the window open.

Doe did not return to the home until about 7:00 am.

9. SA McCaskill also interviewed Michael James Gavlak, a 6th Grade teacher at the LMS. Gavlak is the LMS site representative for Project Venture and works closely with Torvio in managing and administering the program. Gavlak travels with LMS students on all trips hosted by Project Venture. Gavlak reported noticing that, especially on overnight trips, Torivio singled out Doe and spent a great deal of time with her alone. Gavlak talked to Torivio, suggesting that Torivio not spend time alone with any of the students, especially females. Gavlak encouraged Torivio to work with the students in groups and always have another

adult present. Torivio told Gavlak that he didn't see a problem spending time alone with Doe or any other students. Torivio told Gavlak that Doe was only a few years younger than him and that he felt it completely appropriate to spend time with her alone.

10. On April 23, 2010, Torivio was interviewed at his home, located at #7 Haaku Road, Pueblo of Acoma, New Mexico, 87034, by SA McCaskill and Officer Concho. The interview was arranged at Torivio's request. The interview was conducted in the dining area of Torivio's home, with Torivio's mother, Jackie Torivio, listening in. Torivio was verbally advised of his Miranda rights and provided an FD-395, Advice of Rights Form, which he reviewed and executed, agreeing to answer questions. The interview was digitally recorded.

11. Torivio admitted having sexual intercourse, specifically placing his penis in Doe's vagina, on three occasions, once in or about April, 2009, once in late October, 2009, and once at an undetermined time between April, 2009, and October, 2009.

12. In or about April, 2009, Torivio arranged to pick
Doe up along Old Seama Road after she sneaked out of her
house sometime after midnight. After picking Doe up, Torivio
parked his car somewhere along Old Seama Road. Torivio had
sexual intercourse with Doe, both of them in the passenger
seat, pants pulled down, facing each other.

13. In or about October, 2009, late in the month,
Torivio again, arranged to pick Doe up along Old Seama Road
after she sneaked out of her house sometime after midnight.
After picking Doe up, drove to an uninhabited home near his
home. Torivio took her inside the uninhabited home and had
sexual intercourse with her on a bed in the building. Again,
the two had sexual intercourse facing one another with their
pants pulled down. Doe later identified an uninhabited home
located at #9 Haaku Road, Pueblo of Acoma, New Mexico, a the
home to which Torivio took her that night. The uninhabited
home is owned by Jackie Torivio and is located next door to
Torivio's residence, #7 Haaku Road, Pueblo of Acoma, New
Mexico.

10. Based on the training and experience of the affiant, DNA, hairs, fibers, fingerprints, blood, and semen can often be left behind on the surfaces where such sexual activity takes place, including in a vehicle. DNA evidence, in particular, can be located a long time, sometimes years, after the activity which produced the evidence.

The affiant therefore respectfully requests that a warrant be issued for a search of the body of Alexander Frank Torivio, an enrolled Pueblo of Acoma Indian, born in 1986, five (5) feet and three (3) inches tall, weighing approximately 150 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes, to take samples of his blood for DNA testing that can be used to corroborate or refute Doe's account of the sexual activity

between the two. Samples recovered as evidence from the uninhabited home, which is located at #9 Haaku Road, Pueblo of Acoma, New Mexico, and from the 2004 blue, 4-door Kia, New Mexico license plate HAAKU, VIN KNAFE121345064305, is registered to Torivio at #7 Haaku Road, Pueblo of Acoma, New Mexico, 87034, can be compared to DNA developed from the blood obtained from Torivio.

In view of the facts presented in this affidavit, the affiant believes there is probable cause to believe that in or about April, 2009, Torivio an enrolled member of the Pueblo of Acoma, unlawfully engaged in a sexual act with Jane Doe, an enrolled member of the Pueblo of Laguna, within the District of New Mexico, within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo of Laguna, within Indian Country, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 2243 (a), 2246 (2)(A), a crime in Indian Country, Title 18, United States Code, Section 1153.

13. In view of the facts presented in this affidavit, the affiant also believes that there is probable cause to believe that in or about October, 2009, Torivio an enrolled member of the Pueblo of Acoma, unlawfully engaged in a sexual act with Jane Doe, an enrolled member of the Pueblo of Laguna, within the District of New Mexico, within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo of Acoma, within Indian Country, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 2243 (a), 2246 (2)(A), a crime in Indian Country,
