8	AFFIDAVIT

10	I, Daniel J. Sarkozy, being first duly sworn,
11	hereby depose and state as follows:
12	
13	1.) I am a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of
14	Investigation (FBI) currently assigned to the Albuquerque
15	Division, Las Cruces Resident Agency, and have been employed
16	by the FBI for approximately 14 and a half years. As a
17	Special Agent for the FBI, I am authorized to investigate
18	crimes that occur on Indian reservations.
19	
20	2.) All the facts set forth in this Affidavit are
21	personally known to me or have been made known to me by other
22	sworn law enforcement officers.
23	
24	3.) On or about 09/24/2009 at approximately 7:00
25	p.m., an adult male exited a tan/gold colored Ford F-150,
26	four (4) door pick up truck and approached the resident of
27	Dennett Jerome Chee (and family) located at 53 Carrizo
28	Trials, Mescalero, New Mexico and fired eight (8) .45 ACP

rounds into the residence, ran back to the passenger side of 1 the same truck, and fled the scene. The residence was 2 occupied by Chee, his wife Kelani Poncho and their sons (ages 3 2 and 4). The fired rounds struck and penetrated the front 4 wall and window of the Chee residence. All of the rounds 5 entered the home. At least two (2) bullets struck the 6 television set (or surrounding entertainment center) as 7 Dennett Jerome Chee played a video game on it. These bullets 8 entered through the front window, over Chee's shoulder, and 9 into the television. One (1) bullet was recovered from 10 inside the television set and one (1) bullet was recovered 11 from inside an adjacent sound speaker which sat above the 12 television on the entertainment center. Other bullets were 13 recovered from the inside of internal walls of the home. One 14 bullet stopped inside the wall of the kitchen where Kelani 15 Poncho was eating with one of her sons. Other bullets were 16 recovered in the door frame of the children's bedroom located 17 next to the kitchen. The recovered bullets fired into the 18 home were collected as evidence. 19

4.) Eight (8) fired .45 ACP shell casings were 21 22 found on or next to the Chee driveway approximately 33 feet in front of the Chee family room window. Five (5) .45 23 caliber holes were found in the front wall of the Chee 24 25 residence. Three (3) additional bullets were determined to have penetrated the family room's front window, two through 26 27 the glass and one through the window frame. Trajectory rods 28 were placed in the bullet holes. All of these rods pointed

to a firing point approximately 33 feet from the front of the Chee residence in the middle of the Chee driveway. This coincides with the approximate location where witnesses saw a man, fitting the description of Frank Bow Gallerito, fire the gun from.

5.) Several witnesses to the shooting identified 7 Frank Bow Gallerito as the man they believed to have fired 8 the shots into the Chee residence. Further, they identified 9 10 the tan/gold colored Ford F-150 pick up truck (described above) as belonging to Frank Bow Gallerito because they had 11 12 seen him driving that truck earlier that day and because they had seen that truck on numerous other occasions and knew it 13 14 to be Gallerito's truck. They further described the truck as having numerous decals in the rear window. 15

17 6.) Investigating agents traveled to Gallerito's 18 home located at 892 Highway 244, Mescalero, New Mexico in an 19 attempt to locate and interview Gallerito regarding the 20 shooting at the Chee residence. Upon arrival at the 21 Gallerito residence, and in an attempt to contact and interview the occupants of the home, agents crossed a locked 22 23 gate at the end of Gallerito's driveway which displayed a "No 24 Trespassing" sign on it. Agents approached the home, knocked 25 and announced their presence and identities, and announced their the intention to interview Frank Bow Gallerito. Agents 26 27 could hear movement inside the double wide mobile home but received no answer at the door. Agents also saw a person or 28

person(s) inside the trailer looking out the window through 1 the mini-blinds. Agents still received no answer to their 2 calls. Still further, agents contacted Bureau of Indian 3 Affairs (BIA) Mescalero Dispatch and requested dispatch 4 contact the occupants via telephone. Mescalero Dispatch 5 complied and attempted to make a telephone call to the 6 7 Gallerito residence. Agents outside the trailer could hear the telephone ringing but the call went unanswered. 8 While attempting to make contact with the occupant(s), agents 9 10 observed a tan/gold colored Ford F-150, four (4) door pick up truck bearing New Mexico license plate HBP 278 parked on the 11 side of the trailer. The truck matched the description given 12 13 by witnesses at the Chee shooting. The truck was determined 14 to be registered to Mia Basquez, 892 Highway 244, Mescalero, New Mexico. Mia Basquez is known to be the wife of Frank Bow 15 Gallerito. 16

18 Prior to departing from the residence, agents who had been using the Ford pick up truck as cover while watched 19 the side and back yards, noticed three (3) guns inside the 20 truck: 1.) a bolt action, scope sighted hunting type rifle 21 placed between the front seats; 2.) a 1911 type automatic 22 pistol with it's slide locked to the rear on the front 23 passenger seat; and 3.) a Ruger 10/22 semiautomatic rifle 24 25 laying on the back seat. Agents also saw ammunition for each 26 type of firearm observed in the truck. Based upon your 27 affiant's experience and training as a FBI Firearms 28 Instructor, the 1911 type pistol is believed to be a Taurus

PT-1911, .45 ACP pistol. All of these firearms were in plain view and clearly visible by looking through the truck's windows.

7.) Based upon the facts presented above, a 5 Federal Search Warrant (09-365 MR) of the Ford F-150 pick up 6 7 truck (described above) was authorized by The Honorable Karen B. Molzen on 09/25/2009. The search authorized the seizure 8 9 of the firearms described above. Due to safety concerns, 10 agents were unable to maintain close surveillance of the truck while the warrant was being obtained. The warrant was 11 executed on 09/25/2009 but the firearms were not present. 12 Agents did find magazines (feeding devices) for a Ruger 10/22 13 14 semiautomatic rifle and a Taurus PT-1911 pistol. The magazines were seized after consent was obtained from Mia 15 16 Basquez Gallerito. A subsequent consent search of the 17 Gallerito home was authorized by Mia Basquez (Gallerito). The search was also met with negative results for any 18 19 firearms.

21 8.) Subsequent investigation to the shooting has 22 revealed that Mia Basquez (Gallerito) purchased the three (3) 23 firearms described in this affidavit from the Firepower Gun Shop located in Ruidoso, New Mexico. Basquez (Gallerito) 24 admitted that these guns were hers and were in her home prior 25 26 to the shooting at the Chee residence. The owner of Firepower Gun Shop cooperated with the investigation and 27 28 provided proof that Mia Basquez was the owner of three (3)

firearms of the type seen in Gallerito's truck on the night of the shooting. Further, Mia Basquez-Gallerito told investigators that she kept the firearms for protection of her home and her family. Basquez-Gallerito also confirmed that Frank Bow Gallerito lived at the same residence and stayed there the night before the shooting at the Chee residence.

On 09/25/2009, Frank Bow Gallerito was 9 9.) arrested and charged in Mescalero Apache Tribal Court for his 10 role in the shooting at the Chee residence. He is currently 11 jailed at the Otero County Prison Facility located Chaparral, 12 13 New Mexico. After his arrest, Gallerito was read his Miranda 14 Rights. Gallerito acknowledged his Miranda Rights by signing an Advice of Rights form indicating he was willing to answer 15 questions regarding the events leading to his arrest, without 16 a lawyer present. During the subsequent interview, Gallerito 17 18 admitted to shooting at the Chee residence. Gallerito stated 19 that first he fired shots at the residence, then, after 20 giving the gun to Michael Munoz, Sr., Munoz fired the gun at the Chee residence. Gallerito also admitted to being a 21 convicted felon and knowing he was prohibited from owning or 22 23 possessing firearms. Gallerito stated that regardless of this prohibition, he always has access to guns either from 24 25 his house or from friends.

27 10.) On 10/14/2009, Michael Munoz, Sr., Frank Bow
28 Galleriot's brother-in-law, was interviewed regarding his

involvement in the shooting assault at the Chee residence. Munoz stated that Gallerito was the only one that fired the gun at the Chee residence on the night of the assault. Munoz denied taking part in the shooting. He stated that he was very drunk that evening and took no active part in the shooting.

11.) On 09/28/2009, Frank Bow Gallerito plead 8 guilty to the following charges in Mesclero Apache Indian 9 10 Tribal Court for his role in the shooting assault at the Chee 11 residence: 1.) Assault and Battery; 2.) Negligent use of a 12 Weapon; 3.) Criminal Damage to Property; 4.) Disturbing the Peace; 5.) Intoxication; 6.) Tampering with Evidence; and 13 7.) Conspiracy. Gallerito was sentenced and housed in the 14 Otero County Prison Facility located in Chapparal, New 15 Mexico. 16

18 12.) On 09/30/2009 while in jail, Frank Bow Gallerito made several telephone calls from the Otero County 19 Prison Facility to his wife, Mia Basquez (Gallerito). Prior 20 21 to making these telephone calls, a recording informed Gallerito that his conversation could be monitored or 22 23 recorded at any time. During the first of these telephone calls, Gallerito told his wife, "those things, just keep 24 25 them, don't take them to California, just leave them there." 26 Basquez (Gallerito) objected, saying, "I don't really want to." Gallerito told her, "take them to the shed and leave 27 them down there, they'll be alright." Your affiant believes 28

Gallerito is discussing the guns and instructing his wife about where to store the guns and telling his wife to leave them in the shed.

On 09/30/2009, Frank Bow Gallerito made a 5 13.) second call to Mia Basquez-Gallerito. During this call, Mia 6 7 Basquez (Gallerito) told Frank Bow Gallerito that she told the FBI that she had bought the guns in town. Gallerito told 8 her, "what ever you do, just don't fucking give them to them, 9 10 Mia." Mia replied, "I ain't got nothing to give, I don't have nothing, I don't know where nothing's at." Frank 11 12 Gallerito then asked her, "did you tell them where they're at?" Mia replied, "No, I don't know where nothing's at, what 13 did you just hear me say?" 14

14.) On 10/01/2009, Frank Bow Gallerito made 16 another telephone call to Mia Basquez-Gallerito. During this 17 telephone call, Gallerito begins the conversation where the 18 conversation terminated the day before where he and his wife 19 discussed the guns. Frank asked Mia if the "feds" talked to 20 21 her yesterday. He told her the "feds" are trying to make a 22 case against him and they are trying to find the guns. Mia 23 told Frank, "he saw them in the truck, Bow." Bow replied, "I know, but they are trying to find them." Mia stated, "I 24 25 don't know where in the hell they are."

26

27 15.) On 10/05/2009, Frank Bow Gallerito made
28 another telephone call to Mia Basquez-Gallerito. During this

telephone call, Gallerito said, "Hey, those um, those, those ah, remember the family I shot at?" He proceeded to tell his wife the family and/or friends of the Chee family knew who he was and where he was, suggesting they might seek retailation against him for the shooting.

7 16.) On 10/07/2009, Frank Bow Gallerito made
8 another telephone call to Mia Basquez-Gallerito. During this
9 telephone call, Gallerito told his wife he hoped "the feds"
10 do not get involved. He said, "I'm sorry and ah, I'm glad
11 none of that stuff hit anyone."

17.) On 10/23/2009, Frank Bow Gallerito made 13 another telephone call to Mia Basquez-Gallerito. During this 14 15 telephone call, Gallerito talked to his wife regarding the possibility that the Federal Government would pursue criminal 16 charges against him. He discussed other cases on the 17 18 reservation where Federal Charges were not filed and compared 19 them to his case, "And, and what happened? Nothing. You 20 know, nothing. I just don't get it and then, like in my 21 case there was a shooting and it was just, um, shots to the house, no one got hurt or nothing and you know what I mean?" 22

24 18.) On 10/30/2009, Frank Bow Gallerito made
25 another telephone call to Mia Basquez-Gallerito. During this
26 telephone call, Gallerito said to his wife, "And then,
27 hopefully, pray to God, keep praying on it that I be forgiven
28 for shooting at that house."

19.) On 11/04/2009, Frank Bow Gallerito made 1 another telephone call to Mia Basquez-Gallerito. During this 2 telephone call, Gallerito told Mia; "Yeah, I know. Okay, 3 well, um, those fishing poles, just um, don't bother, bother 4 them 'cause they, they got hooks and everything on 'em. 5 Ϊ don't want you guys getting hooked or anything." Mia 6 7 answered, "Yes, I know." 8 On 03/10/2010, United States Magistrate Judge 20.) 9 Carmen E. Garza authorized a search of the Gallerito 10 residence located at 892 Highway 244, Mescalero, New Mexico 11 for the firearms suspected of being used during the assault 12 at the Chee residence. The search was conducted with 13 negative results. 14 15 21.) 16 53 Carrizo Trials, Mescalero, New Mexico, the residence of Dennett Jerome Chee and family, is located 17 within the exterior boundaries of the Mescalero Apache Indian 18 Reservation, the exclusive jurisdiction of the United States. 19 20 21 22.) Frank Bow Gallerito (enrollment number 01934) is an enrolled member of the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe. 22 Dennett Jerome Chee (enrollment number 03628), Kelani Poncho 23 (enrollment number 03545) and both of their minor children 24 25 are enrolled members of the Mescalero Apache Indian Tribe. 26 27 23.)Based on the above information, the Affiant believes that probable cause exists to support the following 28

7 <u>Count 2</u>: - On September 24, 2009, Frank Bow
8 Gallerito did commit the crime of assault with a dangerous
9 weapon (firearm) with intent to do bodily harm against
10 Dennett Jerome Chee and family, in violation of 18 U.S.C.,
11 Section 113(a)(3);

13 <u>Count 3:</u> - On September 24, 2009, Frank Bow
14 Gallerito did commit the crime of violence by the use of a
15 deadly weapon (firearm) in violdation of 18 U.S.C., Section
16 924(c)(1)(A)(iii).
