When questioned, VALLECILLO identified himself as Jose Fernando VALLECILLO-Rodriguez, a citizen and national of Mexico without any immigration documents to remain or reside in the United States. IDENT fingerprint and record checks reveal the subject as Fernando Rivera a citizen and national of Mexico whom had previously been ordered removed from the United States to Mexico as Jose Fernando VALLECILLO-Rodriguez on/about April 23, 1997 and subsequently departed to Mexico on/about July 24, 2003. Records show that VALLECILLO was ordered removed subsequent to a Felony conviction of Second Degree Murder, U.S. District Court State of New Mexico on/about July 13, 1995 to wit; VALLECILLO was sentenced to (16) years incarceration and (2) years parole. There is no evidence that VALLECILLO received the consent of the Secretary of Homeland Security of the United States to reapply for admission into the United States.
