12	I, the undersigned, being duly sworn, hereby, depose and state as follows:			
13	1. I am a Special Agent (SA) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and have			
14	been employed in that capacity for approximately seven years. I am currently			
15	assigned to the Albuquerque Division of the FBI, and have primary investigative			
16	responsibility in crimes which occur in Indian Country including violent crimes such as			
17	as robbery, aggravated assaults, and homicide.			
18	2. The information set forth in this affidavit has been derived from an investigation			
19	conducted by the Navajo Nation Criminal Investigation Services (NNCIS) by Criminal			
20	Investigator (CI) Dale West of the Shiprock District, and Special Agent William Hall of the			
21	FBI, Farmington Resident Agency (FRA), as well as other law enforcement officers of the			
22	Navajo Nation Department Of Public Safety.			
23	3. On April 13, 2010 at approximately 8:30 A.M., the FRA was notified of the			
24	shooting of an apartment in Shiprock, New Mexico (NM) occupied by three adults and			
25	three juvenile children. The shooting was done by Jarin Scott from a vehicle driven by			
26	Chancey Begay. This occurred within the confines of the Navajo Nation.			
27	4. CI West's investigation showed that on April 12, 2010, at approximately 10:35 PM,			
28	Shiprock Police Sergeant (Sgt.) Dave Johnson was checking on an intoxicated person near

the Chaco river Apartments in Shiprock, NM, when he heard two gun shots. Johnson looked in the direction from where the sound of the gun shots had come and observed a truck driving away at a high rate of speed. Sgt. Johnson contacted his radio dispatcher and requested additional units and provided a description of the truck.

5. Navajo Police Officer Ernest Sanisya responded to the area and saw a truck matching the description given by Sgt. Johnson and initiated a traffic stop on U.S. Highway 491 near the Chaco River Apartments. The truck was a 2002 GMC truck with New Mexico license 290MWC. The driver was Chancey Lee Begay, a Navajo Indian adult male. A shotgun was lying in plain view on the right rear passenger seat floor board..

6. CI West arrived at the scene where the traffic stop was initiated and met with the
driver, Begay. CI West advised Begay of his rights via a Miranda warning. Begay advised
he understood his rights and agreed to speak with CI West. Begay stated that Jarin Scott
had asked Begay to give him a ride to the Chaco Apartments. Begay advised they were
friends and that he had known Scott for several years. Begay advised that Scott had shown
Begay where to drive to and that Scott told Begay to drive slowly through the apartment
complex.

7. Begay advised as he drove through the complex, Scott pointed a shotgun out the
passenger window and fired the shotgun twice. Begay stated that as soon as Scott fired, he
quickly drove away from the apartments and was stopped by the navajo Police. Begay
stated he was unaware that Scott was going to shoot at the apartment.

21 8. After advising Jarin Scott of his rights according to Miranda, Scott advised he understood his rights and agreed to speak with CI West. Scott advised he blamed Jefferson 22 Nez, Navajo Indian male, for the break up between Scott and his ex-girlfriend. Scott 23 advised he and his girlfriend had lived together for the last three years and that last month 24 they broke up. Nez is Scott's ex-girlfriend's brother. During the time Scott and his girlfriend 25 were together, Nez would always come around and try to get her drunk and cause 26 27 arguments. Scott stated he had been thinking about all those things Nez had done in the past and felt he needed to do something about it. Scott stated he had only intended on scaring 28

Nez and that is why he shot through the window. Scott advised he had told Begay what he had planned and that Begay had been supportive of him, because of their friendship.

9. Begay and Scott were arrested for Navajo tribal charges and the Remington Hawk, model 982, 12 gauge, serial number 0055532, was taken and placed into evidence. The shotgun chamber was empty, but there were two rounds in the magazine.

10. CI West observed that apartment #222 of the Chaco River Apartments, had a living room window and a bedroom window damaged from the shotgun blast. There had been five people in the room at the time of the incident.

11. Based on the information provided, there is probable cause to believe that on or
about April 12, 2010, Jefferson Nez, Kristen Benally, Michael Walker and three juvenile
children AJ, AB and CN, enrolled members of the Navajo Indian Tribe, who were within the
territorial jurisdiction of the Navajo Indian Reservation when they were assaulted by Jarin
Scott ad Chancey Begay, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1153,
Section 113(a)(3), Section 2, assault with a dangerous weapon, with intent to do bodily
harm, and without just cause or excuse.
