## **BUFFALO MAN INDICTED FOR ADVERTISING, RECEIPT, AND DISTRIBUTION OF CHILD PORNOGRAPHY**

BUFFALO, N.Y.– U.S. Attorney William J. Hochul, Jr. announced today that a federal grand jury in Buffalo has returned a three count indictment charging Jeremy Otrrosinka, 32, of Buffalo, N.Y., with advertising, receipt, and distribution of child pornography. The charges carry a mandatory minimum sentence of five years in prison, a maximum penalty of 60 years, and a fine of \$250,000.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Edward H. White, who is handling the case, stated that according to the Indictment, the defendant created and administered a website that was a password protected bulletin board dedicated to the discussion and sharing of child pornography. On this site, members would post links to images and videos of child pornography and post private message discussions regarding child pornography. Otrrosinka also sent and received emails that attached images and a video of child pornography.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by United States Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS), Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims. The Indictment is the culmination of an investigation on the part of Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, under the direction of Special Agent in Charge, Christopher M. Piehota.
