## **Superior Resident Sentenced to Federal Prison for Possessing Child Pornography**

Madison, Wis. - Stephen P. Sinnott, Acting United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Jason Moore, 35, Superior, Wis., was sentenced on July 24, 2009, by U.S. District Judge Barbara B. Crabb to nine years in federal prison, followed by twenty years of supervised release, for possessing child pornography. Moore pleaded guilty to the offense on May 15, 2009.

Child pornography was recovered on Moore's computer during a September 17, 2007 search warrant at Moore's home. The Court increased the defendant's sentence because some of the child pornography he possessed depicted sexual violence against young children and because he had a pattern of sexual conduct involving children.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by U.S. Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS), Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims.
