WAUNAKEE MAN SENTENCED ON DRUG & GUN CHARGES

Madison, Wis. - Stephen P. Sinnott, Acting United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Owen T. Trainor, Sr., 55, Waunakee, Wis., was sentenced yesterday by U.S. District Judge Barbara B. Crabb to one year in federal prison, to be followed by three years of supervised release, for growing marijuana and possessing a firearm with an obliterated serial number at his home in the Town of Westport in October 2008. Trainor pleaded guilty to these charges on July 24, 2009.

On October 1, 2008, DeForest Police officers and agents from the Wisconsin Department of Justice -Division of Criminal Investigation executed a search warrant at Trainor's home on Reis Road in the Town of Westport. Police located and seized 66 marijuana plants and multiple pounds of cultivated marijuana along with a 9 millimeter Berretta handgun on which the manufacturer's serial number had been removed.

The police also seized \$12,000 in U.S. currency that had been heat sealed in plastic. As part of his plea, Trainor agreed to the forfeiture of the \$12,000.

The charges against Trainor were the result of an investigation conducted by the DeForest Police Department, Wisconsin State Patrol, Wisconsin Department of Justice - Division of Criminal Investigation, and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney Robert A. Anderson.
