**BOUMATIC, LLC, AGREES TO PAY \$100,000
IN SETTLEMENT**

Madison, Wis. - Stephen P. Sinnott, Acting United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Boumatic, LLC, has agreed to pay \$100,000 as part of a settlement with the U.S. Department of Justice on behalf of the Drug Enforcement Administration.

The settlement resolves outstanding claims by the United States alleging that during calendar year 2008, Boumatic failed to comply with certain required DEA regulations for the legal importation of Iodine. Specifically, the United States alleged that Boumatic had failed to submit the required DEA Import/Export certificates and had failed to obtain proper DEA registration as an importer under federal law.

Under the terms of the settlement agreement, the parties agreed that payments made pursuant to the agreement did not constitute an admission of wrongdoing or liability by Boumatic, nor a concession by the United States that its claims were not well founded.

The litigation of this matter has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney Stephen Ehlke. This case was investigated by the Drug Enforcement Administration, Milwaukee District Office Diversion Control Group.
