

An Indictment is a formal, written accusation by a grand jury. The defendant may waive the right to an Indictment, and, if waived, a Federal prosecutor may then charge by Information without grand jury involvement. Federal crimes punishable by less than a year imprisonment may be prosecuted by Indictment or by Information.

I N D I C T M E N T

The Grand Jury Charges:

COUNT ONE

(Illegal Reentry)

1. On or about January 23, 1981, defendant JOSE GUADALUPE REYES-INFANTE, an alien, was apprehended at or near Huntsville, Texas and was subsequently removed by a Voluntary Removal on or about February 5, 1981.

2. On or about February 11, 1983, defendant JOSE GUADALUPE REYES-INFANTE, an alien, was convicted in Harris County District Court, Houston, Texas of an aggravated felony, as defined in 8 U.S.C. § 1101(a)(43), that is, the felony offense of attempting to commit homicide, capital murder of a police officer, in violation of Texas Penal Code 19.03(a)(1) and 15.01. Defendant JOSE GUADALUPE REYES-INFANTE was Ordered to be deported on or about June

7, 1989.

3. On or about November 28, 1988, defendant JOSE GUADALUPE REYES-INFANTE, an alien, was apprehended at or near Huntsville, Texas and was subsequently removed by an Order of Removal on or about April 17, 1992.

4. On or about January 5, 2011, at or near Beckley, Raleigh County, West Virginia, and within the Southern District of West Virginia and elsewhere, defendant JOSE GUADALUPE REYES-INFANTE, an alien, after having been convicted of an aggravated felony and deported and removed from the United States, entered and was found in the United States without first obtaining express consent from the Secretary of Homeland Security or the Attorney General of the United States to reapply for admission to the United States.

In violation of Title 8, United States Code, Sections 1326(a) and 1326(b) (2).
