DENISON WOMAN HEADING TO PRISON FOR FRAUDULENT INCOME TAX RETURNS

(Sherman, Texas) A 48-year-old Denison woman has been sentenced to 15 months in federal prison for subscribing to a false income tax return. SHERRY LYNN DYKES was sentenced last week by United States District Judge Richard Schell. According to information presented in Court, an investigation by the Internal Revenue Service - Criminal Investigation Division revealed that Dykes, an office supervisor for Neurologic & Spine Institute of North Texas in Sherman, substantially understated her income between 1997 and 2001. The tax loss to the government during this time was \$48,902.49.

United States Attorney Matthew D. Orwig was pleased with the sentencing, "Cheating on income tax returns is a severe crime with a just penalty. Honest Americans are the ones penalized even more when cheaters ditch their responsibilities to pay taxes."

This case was investigated by the IRS-CID and was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorneys Randy Blake and Jose Monsivais.
