### Sentencing -- Andrew J. Olmer & Susan E. Olmer

#### FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

Andrew J. Olmer, 44, and Susan E. Olmer, 43, both of Leigh, Nebraska, were sentenced on federal tax charges. Andrew Olmer was sentenced for tax evasion for the 1999, 2000, 2001, and 2002 tax years. Susan Olmer was sentenced for failure to file federal tax returns for the same tax years.

The Honorable Laurie Smith Camp sentenced Andrew Olmer to ten months imprisonment and a fine of \$3,000. After his release from prison, Andrew Olmer will begin a three-year-term of supervised release. He was ordered to make restitution to the United States in the sum of \$38,197.20. He was further ordered to cooperate with the Internal Revenue Service in the collection of restitution, penalties and interest.

Susan E. Olmer was sentenced to a five-year-term of probation. She will serve six months under home confinement and pay a fine of \$2,000. She was ordered to pay restitution in the sum of \$25,870.00 and cooperate with the Internal Revenue Service in the collection of restitution, penalties and interest.

The Olmers are married. Neither had filed a tax return since 1998. Each held jobs as wage earners. Between 1999 and 2000, Andrew Olmer accumulated income taxes totaling \$38,197.00 and Susan Olmer accumulated \$25,870.00 in income taxes. Each of them filed false W-4s with their employers claiming exemption from federal and state taxes.

James D. Vickery, Special Agent in Charge of IRS-Criminal Investigation, stated, "Honest, hardworking Americans pay the price when others choose to evade their income tax obligations. Criminal Investigation's efforts are directed at taxpayers who willfully and intentionally violate their known legal duty of voluntarily filing income tax returns and paying the correct amount of income tax."

Crime(s) Charged and Potential Penalty (A CHARGE is merely an accusation and every defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty): Andrew Olmer was charged with Tax Evasion. Tax Evasion is punishable by a maximum of five years of imprisonment, \$250,000.00 fine, or both imprisonment and fine; three years of supervised release; a \$100.00 special assessment as to each count.

Susan Olmer was charged with Failure to File Tax Returns. Failure to File Tax Returns is punishable by a maximum of one year of imprisonment, a \$100,000 fine, or both imprisonment and fine, one year of supervised release, and a \$25.00 special assessment as to each count.
