QUAD CITIES MAN SENTENCED ON FEDERAL SOCIAL SECURITY FRAUD CHARGE

DAVENPORT, IA - On April 22, 2011, Larry Williams Boyer, age 50 of Silver Springs, Florida, formerly from the Quad Cities, was sentenced by United States District Court Chief Judge Robert W. Pratt to six months of imprisonment, announced U.S. Attorney Nicholas A. Klinefeldt. Boyer had pled guilty to theft of Social Security Income disability benefits from the United States. Boyer was also sentenced to pay restitution to the Social Security Administration of \$42,159.80, a \$100 fee to the Crime Victims Fund and serve 2 years of supervised release. The district court noted the length of Boyer's criminal conduct and the need for deterrence as significant factors for the sentence of imprisonment. From 2001 to 2005, Boyer fraudulently obtained social security disability payments. During this time period, Boyer failed to report that he had obtained employment for substantial periods of time. As part of the restitution ordered, Boyer was required to pay restitution for benefits received on behalf of a child who did not reside with him.

This case was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office, Southern District of Iowa. This investigation was conducted by the Social Security Administration, Office of Inspector General, St. Louis Office.
