DAVENPORT MAN SENTENCED FOR DRUG AND GUN OFFENSES

DAVENPORT, IA – On November 17, 2011, Riley Carnahan, age 38, of Davenport, Iowa, was sentenced to 115 months imprisonment for conspiring to distribute at least 5 kilograms of cocaine and at least 100 kilograms of marijuana and for possessing a firearm in furtherance of drug trafficking, announced United States Attorney Nicholas A. Klinefeldt. United States District Judge John A. Jarvey also sentenced Carnahan to serve five years on supervised release following imprisonment and to pay \$200 to the Crime Victims Fund. Carnahan previously had pleaded guilty to the drug and gun charges.

Between April 2009 and April 2010, Davenport, Iowa, Police investigated a significant drug trafficking organization responsible for packaging, storing, and distributing cocaine and marijuana out of the Penny Juice Company, a business located in Davenport, Iowa. Police determined that Carnahan, a co-owner of the Penny Juice Company, worked with others to arrange multiple deliveries of hundred of pounds of marijuana and one-half kilogram quantities of cocaine. The investigation also revealed that Carnahan possessed multiple firearms which he used at the business to facilitate his drug trafficking.

This case was investigated by the Davenport, Iowa, Police Department and the United States Drug Enforcement Administration, and was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Iowa.
