**WELLMAN MAN SENTENCED FOR  
CONSPIRACY TO DISTRIBUTE METHAMPHETAMINE**

DAVENPORT, IA – On July 21, 2011, Preston Leroy Enlow of Wellman, Iowa, age 46, was sentenced to 120 months imprisonment, for conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine announced United States Attorney Nicholas A. Klinefeldt. Chief United States District Judge Robert W. Pratt also ordered Enlow to serve 5 years of supervised release following his imprisonment and pay \$100 to the Crime Victims Fund. Enlow previously pleaded guilty to this offense.

In the summer of 2009, law enforcement commenced an investigation into a group of individuals responsible for cooking large amounts of methamphetamine at Enlow's farm located in Wellman, Iowa. During the course of the investigation, law enforcement learned that Enlow was responsible for obtaining pseudoephedrine pills from a number of individuals and cooking methamphetamine in out-buildings near his home. Enlow was ultimately responsible for the manufacture of more than 330 grams of actual methamphetamine.

This case was investigated by the Washington-Louisa Drug Task Force, Washington County Sheriff's Office, Keota Police Department, the Iowa Department of Narcotics Enforcement, and was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Iowa.
