## DAVENPORT MAN

### SENTENCED FOR CONSPIRACY TO DISTRIBUTE COCAINE BASE

DAVENPORT, IA – On May 24, 2011, David Gamble, of Davenport, Iowa, age 39, was sentenced to 188 months of imprisonment for conspiring to distribute crack cocaine, announced United States Attorney Nicholas A. Klinefeldt. United States District Judge James E. Gritzner also ordered Gamble to serve 4 years of supervised release following his imprisonment and pay \$100 to the Crime Victims Fund. This sentence followed Gamble's guilty plea on October 22, 2010, to the conspiracy charge.

Starting in November 2009, Gamble was the subject of an investigation regarding the distribution of cocaine base in the Davenport, Iowa, area. On multiple occasions during the course of the investigation, Gamble sold cocaine base to various individuals cooperating with law enforcement.

This case was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Iowa and investigated by the Davenport Police Department, the Iowa Division of Narcotics Enforcement, and the United States Drug Enforcement Administration.
