DAVENPORT MAN SENTENCED TO FEDERAL PRISON ON FEDERAL DRUG CONSPIRACY CHARGE

DAVENPORT, IA - On September 1, 2011, Jamal Jefferson, also known as "Shubu," age 28, of Davenport, Iowa, was sentenced to 142 months imprisonment for conspiracy to distribute crack cocaine, announced United States Attorney Nicholas A. Klinefeldt. United States District Judge John A. Jarvey also sentenced Jefferson to serve at least five years supervised release after imprisonment and ordered him to pay a \$100 special assessment to the crime victims fund.

On January 15, 2010, Jefferson pleaded guilty to conspiring, from December 2006, to February 2008, to distribute crack cocaine. Jefferson agreed that he was responsible for at least 1.5 kilograms of crack cocaine.

The investigation was conducted by the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Iowa Department of Public Safety, Division of Narcotics Enforcement, and the Davenport Police Department and was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Iowa.
