DAVENPORT MEN SENTENCED FOR CONSPIRACY TO DISTRIBUTE COCAINE BASE

DAVENPORT, IA – On September 30, 2011, Damian Lewis of Davenport, Iowa, age 35, was sentenced to 100 months imprisonment, and Jerimiah Quinn of Davenport, Iowa, age 35, was sentenced to 188 months imprisonment, both for conspiracy to distribute crack cocaine, announced United States Attorney Nicholas A. Klinefeldt. United States District Judge John A. Jarvey also ordered both defendants to serve 4 years of supervised release following imprisonment and to pay \$100 to the Crime Victims Fund. Both defendants previously entered guilty pleas to conspiring to distribute at least 28 grams of crack cocaine from July 2010 through September 25, 2010

In the summer of 2010, Davenport Police learned that Quinn and Lewis were distributing crack cocaine to various customers in the Davenport area. Using the assistance of a confidential informant, police purchased crack cocaine on six different occasions in July from Quinn and on one occasion in September from Lewis. After searching Lewis' home, police seized additional crack cocaine and drug paraphernalia. During the course of the conspiracy, Lewis distributed a total of over 800 grams of crack cocaine, while Quinn distributed over 40 grams of crack cocaine.

This case was investigated by the Davenport Police Department, and was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Iowa.
