ROCK ISLAND MAN SENTENCED FOR DISTRIBUTION OF CRACK COCAINE

DAVENPORT, IA – On September 29, 2011, Deshawn Michael Mapp, age 33, of Rock Island, Illinois, was sentenced to 160 months imprisonment for distributing crack cocaine, announced United States Attorney Nicholas A. Klinefeldt. United States District Judge John A. Jarvey also sentenced Mapp to eight years supervised release following imprisonment and ordered that Mapp pay \$200 to the Crime Victims Fund. Mapp was sentenced as a “career offender” under the United States Sentencing Guidelines based on his prior criminal history.

This investigation began in the winter of 2010, when Davenport Police received information that Mapp was selling crack cocaine in the Quad Cities area. Subsequently, in February and March 2010, police used confidential informants to purchase crack from Mapp. On January 19, 2011, Mapp entered a guilty plea to the crack distribution charges.

This case was investigated by the Davenport Police Department, and was prosecuted by the United States Attorney’s Office for the Southern District of Iowa.
