**DAVENPORT MAN SENTENCED**  
**ON FEDERAL DRUG CHARGES**

Davenport, IA – On November 9, 2011, Levi Shelby Roe, age 36, of Davenport was sentenced to 131 months of imprisonment, having previously pleaded guilty to conspiring to distribute methamphetamine, announced United States Attorney Nicholas A. Klinefeldt. United States District Judge John A. Jarvey also sentenced Roe to eight years of supervised release following imprisonment.

From approximately June 2009 to August 2009, Roe conspired with Gerardo Salinas and Luis Razo, Jr., to distribute at least 50 grams of methamphetamine. In June 2010, Salinas was convicted and sentenced to 262 months of federal imprisonment, and Razo was convicted and sentenced to 60 months of imprisonment.

The investigation was conducted by the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Iowa Department of Public Safety, Division of Narcotics Enforcement, and the Davenport Police Department and prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Iowa.
