## CLINTON MAN SENTENCED FOR DRUG TRAFFICKING

DAVENPORT, IA—On April 22, 2011, Terence Soto, also known as Terrance Hood, age 33, was sentenced in federal court in Davenport for conspiracy to manufacture, distribute, and possess with intent to distribute 5 grams and more of cocaine base, also known as crack. The sentencing hearing was held before the Honorable John A. Jarvey, Judge for the United States District Court for the Southern District of Iowa. Hood had previously been convicted on three separate occasions for felony drug offenses. Judge Jarvey imposed a sentence of 188 months in federal prison to be followed by 5 years of supervised release.

The defendant, a former resident of Davenport and Clinton, was arrested in Chicago on September 24, 2009, and found to be in possession of crack cocaine. After he was convicted and sentenced in Illinois, Hood was transported back to Iowa to face federal charges. On November 22, 2010, Hood plead guilty to the conspiracy charge.

This case was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Iowa. The case was investigated by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration, the Iowa Division of Narcotics Enforcement, and the Clinton Police Department.
