## **IOWA CITY MAN SENTENCED FOR DRUG CONSPIRACY AND IMMIGRATION VIOLATION**

DAVENPORT, IA – Today, Miguel Andrade Villagrana of Iowa City, IA, was sentenced by United States District Judge John A. Jarvey to 120 months imprisonment, in connection with Villagrana's previous guilty plea to Conspiracy to Distribute Cocaine and Unlawful Entry After Deportation, announced United States Attorney Nicholas A. Klinefeldt.

In the summer of 2010, law enforcement concluded its investigation regarding Villagrana's sale of quantities of cocaine powder in the Muscatine area. Law enforcement had been investigating Villagrana since early 2009. On multiple occasions during the investigation, Villagrana sold cocaine to various individuals cooperating with law enforcement. Villagrana was responsible for distributing more than five kilograms of cocaine throughout the Southern District of Iowa. After his arrest, the Department of Homeland Security determined that Villagrana had unlawfully re-entered the United States after being deported.

This case was investigated by the Iowa Division of Narcotics Enforcement, Muscatine Police Department, and Department of Homeland Security and prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office, Southern District of Iowa.
