WEEK IN REVIEW – HAMMOND

Hammond, Indiana- The United States Attorney's Office announced the following:

Darrell Loving, 22, of Gary, Indiana, pled guilty before Chief Judge Philip Simon to counts one and three of an Indictment charging him with distribution of cocaine and possession of a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime. These charges were filed as the result of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation GRIT Task Force and the Indiana State Police. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Thomas Ratcliffe.

Darnell Calloway, 29, of Hammond, Indiana, was sentenced by Judge Rudy Lozano to 60 months imprisonment and 2 years of supervised release after pleading guilty to count two of an Indictment charging him with possession of a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime. This case was the result of an investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives HIDTA Task Force. This case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney David Nozick.

Carl Ross Agnew, 28, of Lafayette, Indiana, pled guilty without the benefit of a plea agreement before Chief Judge Philip Simon to counts one and two of an Indictment charging him with distribution and possession of child pornography. Sentencing has been set for 11/22/11. These charges were filed as the result of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Kokomo Police Department and the Indiana State Police. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Jill Koster.

Trinidad Robles, 42, of Cedar Lake, Indiana, pled guilty before Judge Rudy Lozano to count one of an Information charging him with conspiracy to distribute marijuana. Sentencing has been set for 11/4/11. These charges were filed as the result of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney David Nozick.

The specific sentence in each case to be imposed upon conviction will be determined by the judge after a consideration of federal sentencing statutes and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines.
