WEEK IN REVIEW – FORT WAYNE

Fort Wayne, Indiana- The United States Attorney's Office announced the following:

Brad Moore, 31, of Waterloo, Indiana, was sentenced to 2 years probation after pleading guilty to count six of an Indictment charging him with distribution of cocaine and aiding and abetting in the case *US v Watson et al.* This case was the result of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation Safe Streets Task Force. This case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorneys Anthony Geller and Tina Nommay.

Whitney Sparkman, 20, of Mentone, Indiana, pled guilty before Magistrate Judge Roger Cosbey to count one of an Indictment charging her with conspiracy to distribute marijuana. These charges were filed as the result of an investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, the Kosciusko County Drug Task Force, and the Whitley County Sheriff's Department. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Robert Trgovich.

Cedrick Griffin, 30, of Fort Wayne, Indiana, pled guilty before Magistrate Judge Roger Cosbey to count two of an Indictment charging him with use of a telephone in a conspiracy to possess with the intent to distribute crack cocaine. These charges were filed as the result of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation Safe Streets Task Force. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Lovita Morris King.

Mario Gray, 30, of Fort Wayne, Indiana, pled guilty before Magistrate Judge Roger Cosbey to count two of an Indictment charging him with use of a communication facility to possess with the intent to distribute cocaine. These charges were filed as the result of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Tina Nommay.

The specific sentence in each case to be imposed upon conviction will be determined by the judge after a consideration of federal sentencing statutes and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines.
